Please read the following prior to your first visit with Dr. Geis

Dr. Geis is an out-of-network provider and **all visits must be paid in full by the patient** at the time of the appointment. However, after your office visits you will be given a claim form (for all services <u>excluding</u> injections) that you can submit to your insurance for potential reimbursement. **We recommend calling your insurance provider prior to your first visit** to determine your eligibility and benefits. Information has been provided at the bottom of this form for guidance during your call.

Please note that **our office does not submit or follow-up on claims for visits with Dr. Geis**; it is the patient's responsibility to submit these claims in a timely fashion and reach out to their insurance directly with any questions/concerns.

Our office does not provide any claim forms for prolotherapy/trigger point injections or other injections, as these are not commonly reimbursable out-of-network services. If you receive these treatments, you will be given a separate receipt for these services. However, this receipt is for your records only and is not a medically coded form for submission to insurance.

In the event you receive reimbursement for your office visit and/or osteopathic manipulation treatment, the payment should be sent directly to you from your insurance provider. However, there are instances where reimbursements are sent to our office. If this occurs **you will be notified via email within 5-10 business days of receipt**. The email will include details regarding the refund you will receive.

The following information can be used during your call to insurance, however please note that this is only to be used as a guide and should not be considered a complete list or guarantee of coverage or reimbursement.

First, let the representative know that you will be seeing an out-of-network specialist and want to determine what coverage you may have for Dr. Michael Geis (Osteopathic Physician). You will be requesting coverage for: **general office visits** and **osteopathic manipulation treatments**.

If the representative would like specific coding, you may provide the following:

- 1. **99203 or 99204** (**new patient** office visit codes; the 3 or 4 ending will depend on the length/complexity of your appointment)
- 2. **99213 or 99214 (return patient** office visit codes; the 3 or 4 ending will depend on the length/complexity of your appointment)
- 3. 98928 (osteopathic manipulation code; used with almost every visit)

Once they tell you what will be covered, be sure they also tell you what your **out-of-network deductible** is so that you have a good understanding of when you will start receiving reimbursement.
